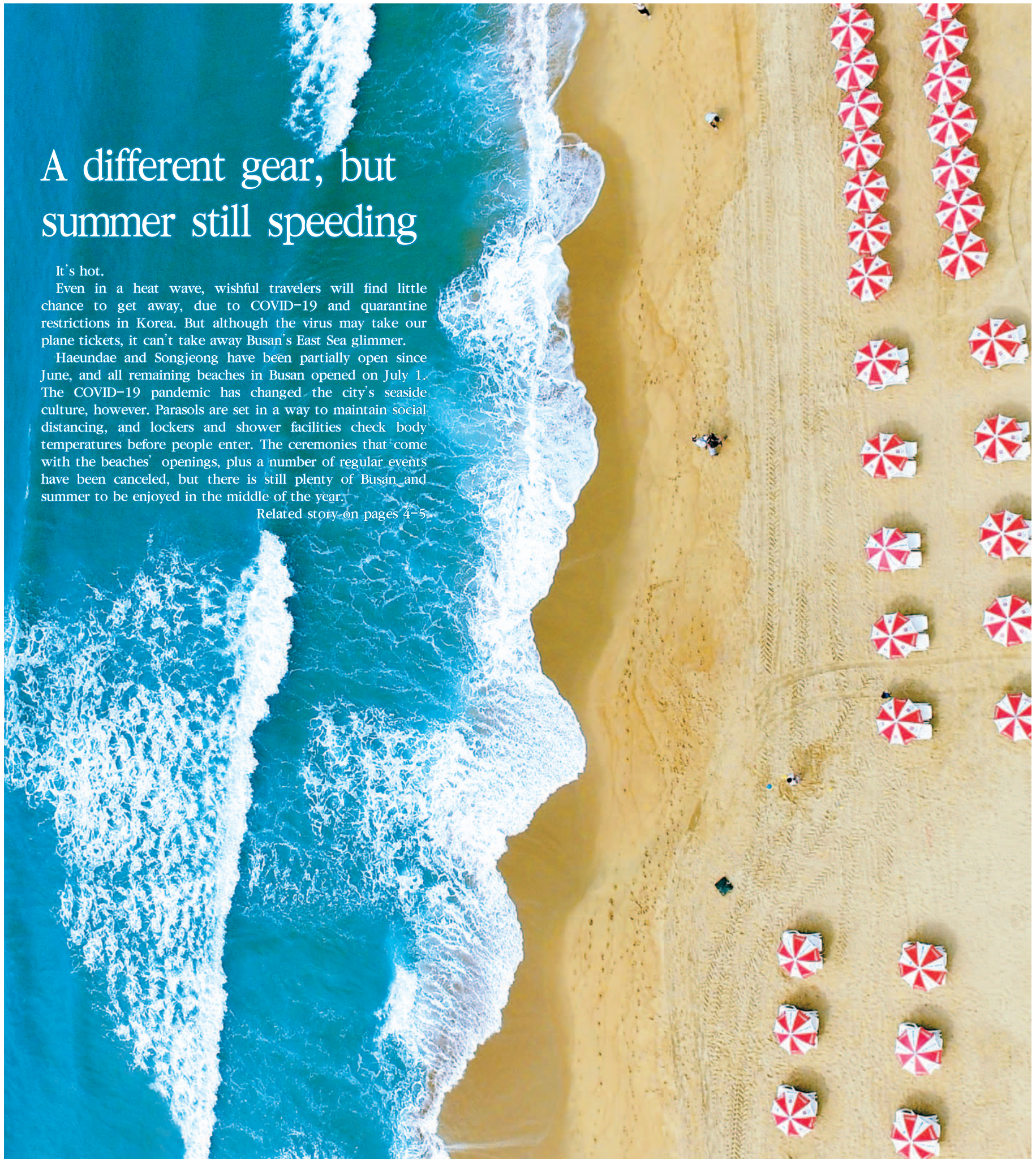
## A different gear, but summer still speeding

Even in a heat wave, wishful travelers will find little chance to get away, due to COVID-19 and quarantine restrictions in Korea. But although the virus may take our plane tickets, it can't take away Busan's East Sea glimmer.

Haeundae and Songjeong have been partially open since June, and all remaining beaches in Busan opened on July 1. The COVID-19 pandemic has changed the city's seaside culture, however. Parasols are set in a way to maintain social distancing, and lockers and shower facilities check body temperatures before people enter. The ceremonies that come with the beaches' openings, plus a number of regular events have been canceled, but there is still plenty of Busan and summer to be enjoyed in the middle of the year.
